



California Conceptions Donor Embryo Program Overview

California Conceptions is a donor embryo program that offers success rates up to 65%-75% per try at a lower cost than using a traditional egg donor. Sometimes referred to as “embryo adoption,” this program gives intended mothers the experience of pregnancy and childbirth, but bypasses the hurdles of traditional adoption.

About the Donated Embryos

The California Conceptions program uses eggs and sperm from anonymous donors to form embryos that are then transferred to the patient. All anonymous donors are thoroughly screened for infectious diseases, medical problems, and meet all state and federal regulations.

How Does the Program Work?

Participants in the program receive information about the donor embryos and have the opportunity to decline a match. Recipients may receive one or two embryos per transfer based on the recipients choice and medical risks. The program offers up to 3 transfers for the same fixed cost. The program is complete after a 12 week pregnancy or after the 3 transfers.

What is the main difference between California Conceptions and traditional donated embryo programs?

Unlike traditional donated embryo programs, the California Conceptions program is designed to have a shorter waiting period and increased availability of anonymous donor embryos. In other donated embryo programs, recipients may have to wait several years for a match. With California Conceptions, most recipient couples can be matched within a few months or less, have up to three embryo transfers, and may qualify for a 100% refund.

100% Refund Guarantee Option

We are so confident in our donor embryo success rates that California Conceptions can offer qualified participants a 100% refund guarantee. This refund can be applied to an additional 3 transfers without a second guarantee.

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What do recipient couples need to know?

Because this is an anonymous donation program, the ability to specify detailed characteristics of the donor embryos will be limited compared to a traditional egg donor program. While the health history of the donors is made available to you, photographs are not provided. Eggs and sperm from recipient couples will not be used in this program to create embryos. Additional treatment options like pre-implantation genetic diagnosis (PGD) for gender selection, and reserving embryos for future siblings, are not offered as part of this program. Different donors will usually be used for each of the 3 transfers.

What happens after I send in the recipient profile?

As soon as we receive your completed recipient profile and current photo of you and your partner (if applicable), we will contact you to discuss the program in detail.

When will I start receiving donated embryo profiles?

There are several steps that must be completed before you receive a donor profile for consideration. Patients and couples will need to complete a counseling session with a mental health provider to review specific topics pertaining to third party reproduction. Uterine testing and blood testing must be completed. After all of the testing and consent forms are completed, participants will be eligible for matching. When a suitable match becomes available, we will forward a profile to you for acceptance. We will do our best to match the general characteristics of recipients. Donor embryos are available on a "first come, first served" basis. Recipients must sign and return the donor embryo profile by the specified date if they wish to move forward. If we do not receive confirmation in a timely manner, the embryos may be matched with another recipient.

What happens when I match and return a signed donated embryo profile?

A program coordinator will contact you with the next steps for moving forward with an embryo transfer. Items such as starting birth control pills, scheduling a baseline ultrasound, visiting a clinical psychologist, signing consents, finalizing payment and treatment calendars, and possible transfer dates will be discussed at that time.
